Luisa Truemper

1. My special school interests are the subjects sports, music, English and French and mathematics. I'm singing in the school choir and I'm playing in the orchestra with my cello. Last year I was the representative of my class in the school conference and since 2 years I'm responsible for our class book.

2. I'm doing lots of sports in my free time.

Two times during the week I play tennis and sometimes also with friends on the weekend. I play since three years and I have a lot of fun playing tennis, because I can play with my friends. Once a week I play badminton. It's very important to me too, because it's the most strenuous sport for me. I'm also very good at downhill skiing, because my family goes skiing every year in Switzerland and sometimes also in Austria. During the summer holidays we're often in Austria too, where we go hiking in the alps. Last summer holidays I went climbing with my father. I also like to go swimming and jogging.

I play cello since three years. Once a week I have lessons, once I take part in the school orchestra and of course I have to practise every day. I also played several times in our church, which I attend almost every Sunday. In my free time I often listen to music, that's why I like to sing in the school choir and I go dancing once a week. I do standard and Latin-American dancing. I love dancing, because we've got balls where we dance competitions.

Once a week I do social work in an old people's home, organized through a program of my school.

3. At first I want to pass my Abitur (high school diploma) successfully. I'm not yet sure what I'm going to study but I'd like to find a job where I can travel a lot and have to speak foreign languages. I could imagine to study or even live in another country, because I want to discover other countries. But maybe I will do something with sports and languages, like a teacher. I like to work with children and young people and I'm really good in taking care of children because of my younger sisters and brothers. Sometimes I go babysitting at some friends of my parents. It's very important to me too that I have a good relation to all my co students, because I don't like cliques in my class.

4. One of my big dreams is to discover other countries. My father travels quite often to foreign countries and I'm always jealous when he tells me what he has seen.

I want to know how the life is outside Europe. I'm a very open minded person who wants to make many friends and I hope to make long-lasting relations which will exist even after the exchange. I want to collect many experiences. Also I want to learn the language and the customs of another culture. I could really imagine studying some semesters abroad. A great part in my decision to go abroad was the fact that we had hosted 14 au-pair girls from different countries in our family. We started it when I was 6 years old up to now. The last years I became good friends with our au-pair girls and they made me curious about their countries (France, South Africa, Canada...). Thus I became interested in spending time abroad.

A very interesting thing to me is also to represent my home there and that I can tell the people in Germany how it is over there. I think that's very important, because there are so many prejudices and ignorance between different countries which should be overcome.

5. My mother worked as a research lab technologist, but since 13 years she's raising her children. My father is a professor at the university. He leads the department of haematology and oncology at the university clinic and he has got a doctor and a professor title.

6. Since 5 years I spent approximately 2 weeks of my summer holidays with a group of youths in my age. I go to sport camps like diving, canoeing or just camping in tents. The other time of my holiday I spent with my family. I was in many different countries in Europe. I also made 2 exchanges to France, both for 2 weeks. I even lived for 3 years in Canada: When I was 2 years old we moved to Toronto. I can't remember much, I just heard that it is a great country and I think it would make much pleasure to me to live there. But even the south-American countries are tempting me.

7. I don't dislike many things, but what I can't stand are people with bad manners. I also dislike people who have got prejudices against other people they don't even know. I'm open for every kind of food. Basically, I like to eat about everything and I even can cook some meals for myself and other people.

10. On a typical non-school day I follow my hobbies. At first I like to sleep in (until 10 o'clock) and then I study for school and practise cello. After that I spend time with my friends, like shopping, playing tennis, go to the cinema or just relax with a bit of music. In the evening (if there's no school the next day) I sometimes go to the restaurant or to the theatre with my parents. Once a month we have got a family day, where the whole family does something together, like hiking, visiting the zoo, etc.

11. In Germany every pupil in one class has got the same schedule. We have got 14 different subjects which are all requirements. For elective subjects we've got only some groups, like computer, choir, orchestra and a third language, which can be done after school is finished. The classes last for 45 min and usually we've got 6 to 8 hours a day. A typical day would look as follows: I get up at 6:30 am, have breakfast and leave home at 7:30 am. I walk to school (about 1 km). On Tuesday my schedule is: German, a double period of maths, physics, religion, French, big break for having lunch and then I go to the orchestra. At 3 pm the school is finished and I walk home. Then I go by bike to the old people's home. I stay there for one and a half hours. After that I do most of my homework. At 7 pm I play badminton, it ends at 8:30 pm. At home I do the rest of my homework. I go to bed around 10 o'clock.

12. We've got a real big house, so that everybody has got his or her own room, where he or she can work alone. The house is located close to the centre of Goettingen, so I can go everywhere by bike, only to my cello lesson my mother has to take me by car. Our house has got a big garden, which is very important to my younger sisters and brothers (and for our two little rabbits and the guinea pig).

13. I've got two sisters and two brothers. Johanna is 5, Lukas 9, Jacob 11 and Julika is 12 years old. Johanna is going to go to school next year and right now she attends nursery school. Lucas goes to the third grade. He plays the drums and has swimming lessons. Sometimes I help him with his homework. Jacob is in sixth grade and Julika attends the eighth grade. They're playing tennis, too, Jacob plays the trumpet and Julika plays the piano and the bassoon.

14. Goettingen is a medium-sized city with 130.000 inhabitants. It has got a nice historical center with a large and famous university. There is also some industry; the major employer is the university hospital and ALCAN aluminum.

15. I don't read many books. I usually read the daily paper and some magazines like National Geographic. I read J. K. Rowling. I tried to read the fifth Harry Potter in English, but it was still a little bit difficult. Otherwise I like to read crime stories. When I have got enough free time I also read specialized books about other religions and customs.

16. I think the major issues confronting young people today are peace for mankind, education for all, sustainable development and ecology and another problem is of course alcohol and drug abuse.

The most important issue to me is peace between the people of this world. I think there should be more exchanges between different cultures. It would be really helpful for the understanding between religions, cultures, etc. Young people should learn to accept people who are different to themselves. It would be a great thing, if every youth had to do an exchange in the 11th or 12th grade. I discovered that there are so many young people my age in Germany who don't even know e.g. where Chile is located. There are so many prejudices between the countries, which cannot be solved by declarations of politicians alone. If there weren't any prejudices between the countries and people would learn to accept the others it would be a great step for mankind. I hope there will be more and more exchanges, I think that's part of the solution to a great problem.
